"One Smooth Stone!"

I am sure most of us remember the account of David and Goliath. In I Samuel 17 we are presented in detail of the conflict between the armies of Israel and the Philistines. And more specifically between the Philistine, Goliath, and David because all the soldiers were greatly afraid. The climax of the battle is verse 48-49.

48 As the Philistine moved closer to attack him, David ran quickly toward the battle line to meet him. 49 Reaching into his bag and taking out a stone, he slung it and struck the Philistine on the forehead. The stone sank into his forehead, and he fell face down on the ground.

How many times do we hear about how brave David was, and how amazing that he struck Goliath down with only one stone?

The truth of this passage is that David's bravery and the one smooth stone had nothing to do with the victory over an unbeatable champion. It was where David's trust and confidence came from.

In verses 45-46 we see the heart and mindset of David.

David said to the Philistine, "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the LORD Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied. ⁴⁶ This day the LORD will deliver you into my hands.

Question? What would happen if each one of us and the church would live each day in this truth! Living each day and each moment in the truth of Gods power and authority against the giants of this dark world.

This Thanksgiving I am thankful for so many things. But one prayer of

thankfulness that I will pray in a new way is to thank God for His Son Jesus. That He suffered and died and rose from the grave in all power and authority so that we may live in victory over sin and the giant that try to destroy us. Lord teach me to live as a warrior in the army of the living God.
