

On Maundy Thursday, we saw Christ taking the Passover meal with his disciples. After dinner, they sang a hymn and Christ took his disciples to the Garden in Gethsemane to pray. Our cantata, *In Calvary's Shadow**, begins here and follows the traditional path of Good Friday, starting in the garden, moving to the cross, and ending with Christ's burial in the tomb.

We will again use the symbolism of a Tenebrae service, extinguishing candles as we go. We will close the service with a *strepitus*. The strepitus (Latin word meaning 'noise,' or 'crash') is a loud noise that symbolizes the closing of the tomb. At the end of the service, we will extinguish the Christ Candle, hear the strepitus, and exit the sanctuary in silence.
